

## GSv2 'Fast-tracking' option now available for projects seeking retroactive registration

As per Gold Standard rules, projects applying for retroactive registration must undergo a 'Pre-feasibility Assessment' (PFA), which is required to assess whether a proposed retroactive project activity<sup>1</sup> can apply for registration under the Gold Standard.

However, it has been noted that under specific circumstances defined below, a pragmatic approach could be taken to increase efficiency without the loss of quality in the retroactive assessment process. Thus, the Gold Standard now offers a 'fast-tracking' option for projects applying for retroactive registration that meet the following conditions:

- 1) The project is applying under the retroactive project cycle.
- 2) The retroactive registration fee, same as for the conventional retroactive registration process, has been paid by the project proponent and received by the Gold Standard Foundation.
- 3) The project proponent is 'experienced with GS' and in particular with GS requirements for the type of project activity proposed, i.e. it has submitted at least 5 projects to the GS overall, and has received one or more pre-feasibility assessments (PFAs) from GS for the same type of project activity and applying the same (or similar) version of a given methodology.
- 4) The DOE contracted to validate the project activity fulfils one of the following requirements:
  1. The DOE has submitted at least 10 validation reports to GS overall in the year prior to the start of validation of the project activity proposed for the 'fast-track' process, and at least 3 validation reports for project activities making use of the same methodology than the project submitted through the 'fast-track' process.
  2. An auditor of the validation team taking care of the submitted project activity has either attended a GS DOE training workshop within the last 6 months prior to the start of validation of the project activity proposed for the 'fast-track' process, or commit to a training that will have to be conducted within the first 3 months of the validation process. In the latter case, if the condition is not met a pre-feasibility assessment will have to be performed by GS as per the conventional rules for retroactive registration, i.e. validation will only be considered if the outcome of the pre-feasibility assessment is positive, and the validation will have to report on the issues raised by GS during the pre-feasibility assessment.
  3. An auditor of the validation team taking care of the submitted project activity has attended a GS DOE training webinar within the last 6 months.

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### **The Fast-track process consists of the following steps:**

- 1) Project proponent applies for the fast-track process by first contacting the Gold Standard Secretariat (closest GS Local Expert<sup>2</sup>) and by providing the proof of compliance (i.e. a list of project ID numbers, auditor names, webinar/workshop dates, etc) with the criteria listed above for both the project proponent and the DOE.
- 2) GS Secretariat checks whether the project activity submitted for the fast-track pre-feasibility meets the eligibility criteria and if so, sends a project-based Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to project proponent.

- 3) Project Proponent signs the project-based MoU and sends back to GS.
- 4) GS Secretariat signs the project-based MoU and returns to the project proponent, then “lists” the project in the registry.
- 5) Project proponent prepares the project documentation in the light of feedback received for the most recent other similar project activities submitted for a pre-feasibility assessment.
- 6) Project proponent to upload the revised project documentation (PDD, Passport, etc.) into the GS registry and to submit for validation by a GS experienced DOE, as defined above.

***This fast-tracking option is considered a pilot phase and will be revisited after 6 months.***
